“One of the major cultural shifts of the last decade has been the growing recognition of the prevalence and manifestation of mental health issues in the workplace. Although I think this is a positive trend it leaves many questions unanswered: What is the relationship between mental health and safety? What role should safety professionals play in mental health programming? Does the National Standard for Psychological Health and Safety provide an adequate basis for health and safety programming around mental health issues? This presentation will focus on answering these questions. I argue that health and safety professionals bring a unique perspective and considerable value to dealing with mental health issues at work.”
